

PROJECT UPDATE MAY 2023

BALLYNISKY Green Energy

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As of May 2023, the proposed Ballynisky Green Energy project is at the pre-planning stage. We welcome continued engagement with the community. We are available via phone, email and are offering one to one consultations to all residents in the vicinity of the proposed project.

Planning Application

We expect to submit a planning application for the project in the Summer of 2023. Please note that our website will be updated with the details of the planning application once submitted on the updates section of the site.

Key Information

- 6 turbines will be proposed on the application.
- The hub height (tower) is 90 metres in height and the maximum tip height for the turbine is 158 metres.
- A setback distance of 650 metres will be adhered to from every residence. The current guidelines specify a minimum distance of 500m. We can provide you with an exact measurement if you provide the Eircode for your home.
- A Community Benefit Fund estimated at approximately €150,000 per annum will be generated.

Why?

To provide power for over 15,000 houses per year. To reduce our country's carbon emissions by 16,000 tonnes per year. To power and protect the future of our country by creating renewable, clean energy.

When?

We aim to submit our planning application to Limerick City and County Council in the Summer of 2023. Subject to approval, work is expected to be completed on site, with the development fully connected to the national grid in 2025.

Where?

The project maps are shared on our website. These maps detail zoning, property setback, site constraints and considerations for the proposed site.
